Walk For December - The Preston Guild Wheel

The Guild Wheel was a project to commemorate the 2012 Preston Guild and the object of the exercise was to join together a collection of pathways to provide a twenty one mile circular route of a good standard, for walkers and cyclists around Preston.

For our walk, we decided to concentrate on the best part of the route, taking in a length of the River Ribble. We started by catching the 'bus from Longridge to the Crematorium from where we started the walk, along the pretty driveway from which a path led off into Red Scar Woods followed by a steep descent into the river valley. From here, we entered the Lancashire Wildlife Reserve at Brockholes where squirrels were running around and a solitary buzzard soared overhead. The path now wandered through a series of small lakes, popular with fishermen and we later decided to stop to have a look at a new hide. Apparently, the original was soon

demolished by local vandals, so it was replaced by this hefty steel structure that would have survived WW3.

We now arrived at the river and a vote was taken as to whether we lunched at the centre or continue on to Avenham Park. As our performance had been quite brisk up to now, we decided to go straight to the park, along a wide pathway which passed under the M6, the A59 at Brockholes Brow and later crossed the busy A6 via a pedestrian crossing. Along this section, we encountered a small cart, pulled by a Shetland Pony and further along the path, we were passed by a group of cyclists from behind. During the walk, the cyclists were quite courteous, despite recent reports in the local press, but these were a little different, the first one rode a Victorian "Sit up and beg", closely followed by a Penny-Farthing!

We were now entering Preston, along the Boulevard and were soon in Avenham Park and on to Miller Park for our scenic lunch stop. The Bolton group were genuinely impressed with the parks and two of us recounted our experiences of the park displays during the 1952 Guild.

All we had to do now was to cross the town to the 'bus station and home, but on the way we gave a history tour to the "Foreigners."

This was our first experience of the Guild Wheel and we were all quite impressed with it. The paths were in good shape and easy to follow, thanks to good signage. Now, how about doing the whole 21 miles on our bikes!

Lent 2014

In January a Food Bank was opened in Longridge. This is a branch of the Trussell Trust Food Bank based in Clitheroe and is run by Churches Together in Longridge. It is based in St. Paul's Church and opens on Friday mornings. Food is only available to those with vouchers issued by a recognised authority. However the opening of the bank has meant that we have had to make some fairly late changes to our usual Lent arrangements. The Church of England hold the chairmanship of CTL during 2014 which would normally mean that any joint activities will take place in either St. Lawrence's or St. Paul's. The planning meetings and Friday prayers are taking place at St. Lawrence's but the Women's World Day of Prayer service cannot take place at St. Paul's as planned and will be transferred to Christ Church. A further change is that the service will take place at 11.00 am before the Lent lunch. It will also not be possible to hold a Lent lunch at St. Paul's so four lunches will take place at Christ Church but two of them will be prepared and staffed by the Church of England folk.

Much of the food distributed at the food bank comes from collections at supermarkets. Like several other of the Longridge churches, we are continuing to support other organisations helping those in need and in particular the Fox Street Night Shelter in Preston. There is a yellow/orange box in the foyer for any gifts. They are asking for gravy granules during March; cordials in April and UHT or powdered milk in May.

URC Vacancy

We have had a letter from the Lancashire Area Convenor of the North West Synod telling us that Mrs Dianne Knight, the Area Secretary is to step down and therefore they are looking for a successor. There is a letter on the notice board with the job description. As there is no mention of money, we assume that this is a voluntary post and therefore would require someone with a considerable amount of time to offer. The letter also mentions two other voluntary posts on the Area Pastoral Committee which would be more manageable and probably quite interesting. If you are interested perhaps you could mention it to Sue Gaunt before the Synod/ Area Meeting on March 8th.

Walk For January - Condor Green Round

Finding a suitable walk this month proved to be a bit of a challenge because the endless heavy rain meant that the countryside was totally waterlogged and any walk that involved crossing a field was out of the question. Therefore, we decided to revisit an old favourite that would give us a circuit of good dry paths, or so we thought!

We started the walk from the car park at Condor Green and headed north on the old rail-bed of the Glasson branch line. This is a good pathway used by walkers and cyclists which takes you into Lancaster. However, we covered the first two miles, enjoying excellent views over the Lune estuary and the Lakeland hills and thankful for the excellent weather that the day provided.

We now left the coastal path and started the steep climb up to the village of Adcliffe, with its collection of large, smart modem houses, followed by a short section of main road walking down to the Lancaster Canal. From here we followed the tow-path south until we came to a bridge with a couple of seats and our leisurely lunch stop.

On our way again, the paved path came to an end and it became very wet. In places, the water drained off the adjoining fields directly over the path and into the canal. Later, looking to the fields on our right, we noticed three Heron, whilst over on the opposite bank, a Wagtail gave us a sprightly flying display. Later, we were passed by two narrow boats, both with weather protection in place at the rear, something rarely seen whilst on the move.

Eventually, we arrived at Galgate and were met by three beautiful Swans just before the junction of the Glasson Link. The pathway down to Glasson Dock was just as bad as the previous one, but improved as we passed the locks. Eventually, we left the canal at

Thurnham mill and returned to Condor Green by road, finally stopping for a coffee at the Cafe'd Lune.

It appears that the next few walks will be somewhat "Urban" as we search for good dry solid pathways and more and more of our traditional haunts disappear under water. However, we will always come up with something worthwhile as the North West has such a wide variety of opportunities.


