### **Rev Ray Writes**

As I sit to write this article I am confronted by the news of fighting in Virginia USA and of a car deliberately driven into a crowd, killing at least one person.

Contrast that with a text from St John's Gospel (chapter 15) in which Jesus told his disciples that he loved them so much, he was willing to give up his life for them. In the same way that God the Father loved Jesus the Son, so he in turn loved his disciples. Then he issued a command saying, "Love one another as I have loved you".

We see here a progression. Love starts with God who passes it onto his Son, who passes it onto his followers who are then commanded to pass it on to one another. Jesus knew that love cannot be hoarded like some commodity or it will achieve precious little. It needs to be passed on from person to person and as it circulates, it grows in quantity and depth.

So how do we end up with people fighting one another on the streets, on a football terrace, or on estates? I'm sure there are political and sociological explanations for in-fighting, but I'm not learned enough to cite them, explain them or comment on them. I am a man of faith and my observation is that perhaps we have taken Jesus' command to "love one another" and morphed it into something like "love those who... are like us... agree with us... stand for the same things... come from the same tribe... etc". We miss the conditional second half of the command - "Love one another as I have loved you". We are to love in a way that mirrors Jesus' love for everyone he met; people who

were not like him, people who didn't agree with him and people who didn't like him.

The challenge of the gospel is to love those who are like us and different from us, those who agree with us and those who oppose us, those we like and those we don't like, those who like or dislike us. Now that is a challenge!

### Sierra Leone

You will have heard on the news about the latest disaster to hit Sierra Leone. John Spencer has spoken by phone to Sarah Moiwo who runs the Skills Training Centre in Kailahun and Ali who drives Albert Beah, the president of the Methodist Church around the country and they tell us that the rain is heavy in the East of the country but nothing like as bad as in the area of Regent on the outskirts of Freetown. There have been no reports of deaths or injuries amongst church members. However, there are two Methodist denominations in Sierra Leone and the United Methodist Church which was founded by American Missionaries, has suffered losses including some deaths and many made homeless. In Britain we will be supporting fund-raising for those in need and this will be distributed by the church in Freetown. More details should be available in the next few days and weeks.

### **Pastoral Care at Christ Church**

Thank you to all those people who contributed to the meeting in June when we discussed how to provide pastoral care at Christ Church. We are fortunate that our membership numbers are currently on the increase but there are fewer of us who are able to undertake regular pastoral visiting. As a result, visiting has been somewhat irregular over the last two or three years, although we have been able to maintain the delivery of The Messenger to those living in the immediate area of Longridge.

As a result of our meeting, we have decided that we need to audit our current pastoral lists and check again if everyone on them actually do want to receive the magazine. We are recruiting and training some new visitors and we think we might in future use the telephone more often to help us keep in touch with people. You may therefore see changes in the coming months, but we will endeavour to keep you in touch with how these may affect you.

Much pastoral care is exercised informally through our regular contacts at services; the Guild; the rambling group; craft Group and Friday coffee or meeting our neighbours in the regular rhythm of life around the town. We would be delighted to see more people at church events so we can get to know you better.

# Music Messaging for The Brain: A Study in Semantic Retrieval with Music Distraction

Music is part of all our daily lives. Music can change our emotions and it has the power to transform us. The aim of this study is to understand how the brain stores music and



lyrics to support communication for people with Alzheimer's. You will be asked to retrieve from your memory the lyrics of nursery rhymes from the title, visually presented via a computer, in quiet conditions and with



the distraction of melody, song or speech. The study requires that you have normal or corrected to normal hearing. The task will take about 60 minutes. We require both male and female participants aged 50+ and 18-39. If you would like to participate or have any


